Energy **saving** solutions

Effectively managing your energy bill involves adopting energy-efficient practices and utilizing programs designed to help you save. Dakota Electric provides a variety of tools and tips for members to lower their energy consumption and costs.

Energy-Efficiency Tips

Implementing small changes in your daily routine can lead to significant energy savings:

Window management: Use window coverings to regulate indoor temperatures — open them for warmth in winter, close them to block heat in summer.

Seal air leaks: Apply caulk and weather stripping around drafty doors and windows to stop air from escaping your home, which forces your heating and cooling system to work harder.

Maintain heating and cooling systems: Regularly service your heating and cooling systems, and replace furnace filters every month or as advised by the manufacturer. Clean warm-air registers, baseboard heaters, and radiators to ensure they function efficiently.

Programs and Rebates

Dakota Electric offers various programs to help members manage their energy usage:

Cycled Air Conditioning® program: Enroll in this program to receive a \$39 summer bill credit or a reduced price on the electricity your central air conditioner uses.

Load management programs:

Members can enroll in load management programs that shift energy usage to off-peak times, helping to reduce overall demand and keep electricity rates affordable. These programs apply to various electric appliances, including water heaters, electric heating systems and irrigation pumps.

Energy Wise® rebates: Dakota Electric offers rebates for upgrading to energy-efficient appliances and equipment, such as air-source heat pumps, ground-source heat pumps and electric water heaters. These rebates help offset the initial investment in energy-saving technology, ultimately lowering long-term energy bills.

Battery powered yard tool rebates: Switching to batterypowered yard tools can lead to
energy savings. Dakota Electric
offers rebates ranging from \$25 to
\$50 for qualifying equipment.

Apple Valley franchise fee

Beginning in March 2025, Dakota Electric members in Apple Valley will see an updated franchise fee on their bills, as approved by the city. The fee is set at 3% of monthly electricity usage, with a maximum charge of \$25 for residential accounts and \$75 for commercial accounts. For example, a residential account with a monthly electric bill ranging from \$100 to \$200 can anticipate a fee between \$3 and \$6. Dakota Electric does not retain any portion of this fee — it is fully passed on to the city of Apple Valley. RTA charge and advanced meter recovery fee

There will be an increase to residential members' bills in 2025 due to the resource & tax adjustment (RTA) charge and advanced meter recovery fee.

How Much is the Increase?

For residential members, the 2025 RTA will be a \$0.0113 surcharge per kilowatt-hour, which is \$0.0131 greater than 2024. The 2025 advanced meter recovery fee will be 78 cents per residential meter, which is 20 cents higher than December 2024. Together, the fees will increase the average residential member's bill a total of about \$9.29 per month. Commercial accounts should contact an account representative to discuss the RTA charge for their rate class.

Rate case update

Dakota Electric submitted a general rate case petition to the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission on Dec. 30, 2024, requesting an overall annual revenue increase of about 11% or \$23.8 million.

The filing includes an interim increase while our general rate case is being reviewed. A 9.5% increase will apply to electricity use beginning in March 2025. This interim increase appears on your bill as "Interim Rate Adjustment."

State agency regulatory staff is now reviewing the filing for procedural compliance. Like all general rate case filings, this filing is expected to be referred to the Office of Administrative Hearings for further review. To learn more about the rate case, please visit www.dakotaelectric.com/rates.
